School-wide Progress Monitoring Plan

State law requires a Progress Monitoring Plan (PMP) when a student is functioning below grade level and is not on track for promotion. Refer to the *Student Progression Plan* for the desired student performance level for grades K-2. The desired level of performance for grades 3-12 for reading, math, and science is level 3; for writing it is a minimum score of 4.

SCHOOL-WIDE DIAGNOSTIC INSTRUMENTS

READING	Fall and Winter Diagnostic tests, SRI tests, fluency test for level 1 and level 2 students.
MATH	Fall and Winter Diagnostic tests, classroom assessments, semester exams and end of course exams.
WRITING	Palm Beach Writes.
SCIENCE	Fall and Winter Diagnostic tests, classroom assessments.

SCHOOL-WIDE STRATEGIES AND INTERVENTIONS

Strategies and interventions are determined by the diagnostic assessments.

READING	Reading and language arts teachers will review and analyze diagnostic data from EDW and focus on areas of weakness. Students performing below grade level will be invited to attend evening and Saturday tutorial sessions.
MATH	Math teachers will review and analyze diagnostic data from EDW and will focus on skills necessary to improve areas of student weakness. Intensive math will be provided to students in need of supplemental math instruction.
WRITING	Language arts teachers will develop, administer and analyze teacher developed assessments that are aligned with NGSSS. Palm Beach Writes will be administered and reviewed according to the district calendar.
SCIENCE	Science teachers will review and analyze diagnostic data from EDW and will develop focus lessons to reinforce areas of student weakness.

FREQUENT MONITORING
