Safe School Ambassadors

Safe School Ambassadors is an international program that originated in Palm Beach County in December, 2000. In it, students who represent the various sub-groups of a school campus are identified, recruited, and trained to intervene when they encounter mistreatment on their campuses. Adult staff members recommend students who are considered social opinion leaders within their sub-groups. Recommended candidates possess three characteristics: They are strong enough to speak up in their sub-groups even if their friends do not agree with them; they are out-going enough to initiate contact with people they do not know well and they exhibit characteristics of compassion. Students attend an initial training event with their adult advisors and are supported via follow-up meetings conducted by campus staff. These meetings last about 30 minutes, are scheduled approximately every three weeks, and are conducted during non-academic time. Ambassadors learn to identify five different forms of common mistreatment, including deliberate exclusion, put-downs, intimidation, physical mistreatment, and acts against groups (e.g. racism, xenophobia, homophobia). They are trained in diplomatic communication skills, including balancing, support, reasoning, directing, distracting, active listening, and strategies for getting help.

Academic Games

Academic Games is a national competition in which players win by out-thinking each other in mathematics. Formal tournaments are organized by local leagues and on a national level by the Academic Games Leagues of America.

Creative mathematic strategies are used to create equation goals and then find solutions to that goal while challenging the opponents. Using the six basic mathematical operations (+ - x ÷ ^) and 24-number and -symbol cubes, students created goals, solutions and challenges, until time was called and points were tallied. Our school takes part at the local competition. At the beginning of each school year students are encouraged to join the Math Academic Team to learn, practice, and later to compete against other schools from Palm Beach County.

The math tournament lasts for two months and we attend four formal competitions. Individual students and teams with high scores will advance to the state competition.

Forensic Program



Introduce your future Forensic Scientist to a highly interactive, high-end forensic science program. Students will take a three year journey into the techniques and uses of forensic science.

While in 6th grade students will be introduced to terminology and basic techniques while they learn the past and present uses of forensic science.

As a 7th grader the student will learn the interconnection between life science issues and forensic science. Students will use new techniques to help identify health issues and concerns.

Our 8th graders will take Integrated Science Honors/Intro-Forensic Chemistry where they will solve "crimes" with techniques that they have learned and mastered in their 8th grade chemistry focused class.

This program definitely is the real deal!



National Junior Honor Society

The National Junior Honor Society is a club by invitation only. A student must meet the required grade point average to be invited. The NJHS meets on a monthly basis. Candidates meet the 2nd Friday of every month at 7:30 am in the cafe. Members meet the 1st Friday of every month at 7:30 am in the cafe. Students are required to attend at least 5 meeting and accumulate 30 plus community service hours within a specific time frame.

The NJHS makes donations to local and far reaching groups that the students choose. The NJHS had adopted local families for the holiday season as well as even sponsoring a birthday party for a 9 year old at the local fire department! This club is under the direction of Mrs. Gates and Mr. Malavar.

Who Killed Lois M?

The 8th grade forensic academy students will soon be working on their first big mystery crime case. The students will use all their skills to help solve this crime. They will analyze hair, fiber, handwriting, blood (simulate), fingerprints and ink samples along with other clues in order to solve this crime. Students will then present their findings by writing a scenario based on their analytical information. This is our first major CSI Logger's Run activity!

The Character Counts Program is designed to teach, model, encourage, and celebrate demonstrations of good character and responsible decision making amongst our students.

Robotics Club

This year the FLL LEGO Robotics Competition was focused on the 2011 Food Factor Challenge. Students explored the topic of food safety and examine the possible points of contamination our food encounters--from exposure to insects and creatures, to unsterile processing and transportation, to unsanitary preparation and storage--then find ways to prevent or combat these contaminants. In the Food Factor Challenge, the Robotics Team built, tested, and programmed a robot to solve a set of Food Safety missions. Throughout the year the team focused on a set of FLL Core Values: teamwork, learning from each other, friendly competition, gracious professionalism, and having fun. The Robotics Team definitely had many challenges that they all faced them using the FLL Core Values. As their coach, it was great watching the team come together as a cohesive unit as well as how they learned from each other. The Robotics Team includes: Hayley Barr, Samuel Chang, Matthew Diaz, Justin Gonzalez, Jenna Isaacs, Cristina LaBarbera, Ilana Szlamkowicz, and Julie Tomanio. The competition will be held on Saturday, January 28, 2012 at Safe Schools on the Don Estridge Middle School campus from 8:00 until 3:30. There will be 16 Palm Beach schools competing and we hope to be one of the schools that places this year.

Medical Academy News

The medical academy provides students with a background in all the Health Care professions in the industry. Students get involved in hands on lab activities such as mammalian dissections, create medical hand books, and complete medical internships with health care professionals of their choice. 6th grade students are currently creating an ABC Medical Handbook, while the 8th grade students are completing their clinical internships and writing their portfolios. 7th graders are writing a research paper on a disease or disorder of their choice.

Social Studies Academic Games

Social Studies Academic Games develop character, integrity, and excellence through academic competition. Students are rewarded for their accomplishments in the same way sports champions are recognized at an award ceremony. Players first learn to play at their schools, and compete against students from other schools in their area. Winners then move up to Regional events and the National Tournament. This year we are studying Presidents 1-24, Current Events, and the theme for this year is the Supreme Court. We meet every Monday and Wednesday from 3:34-4:45 for Social Studies Academic Games in portable 1004.
